Willingboro boys win sectional track championship

Victories in four events propelled Willingboro to first place in th NJSIAA Central Jersey Group 1 track meet Sunday.

Willingboro amassed 97 points, more than twice the total of runner-up New Providence (45 points). The Chimeras finished first in three running events and added a victory off the track at the Bennett Center in Toms River.

Jayaire King, George Milton, Cristian Coto and Onaje Howell teamed to win the 4 x 400-meter relay in 3:33.95. Milton won the 55 dash in 6.70 seconds. Jahaad Beckford won the 55 hurdles in 7.98 and Justin McMaster took the shot put with a throw of 44 feet, 9½ inches.



Willingboro was aided by second-place finishes from Aaron Cooper in the 800 (2:04.38), King in the 400 (52.44) and O'Ryan Turner in the high jump (6-2). Samuel Marcel was third in the shot put (43-2¾), Beckford third in the 400 (53.27) and Rico Patterson third in the 55 hurdles (8.41).

DeVon Watson was fourth in the hurdles, .01 behind Patterson, and fourth in the 55 dash (6.85). Tim Richardson was fourth in the pole vault (10-0).

Jonathan Cunningham of Burlington City won the 400 in 51.83 and was second in the 55 in 6.77. Palmyra's Sam Aviles was second in the hurdles (7.98) and Clayton Tennison was third in the pole vault (10-6).

The Willingboro girls were second in Group 1 with 59 points. Willingboro won the relay in 4:14.18 with a team of Aslee Allman, Jordan MacRae-Ross, Donyae Shelton and Kenady Wilson. The Chimeras' other title came from Wilson, who took the high jump with a 5-foot clearance.

MacRae-Ross placed second in the 55 dash in 7.50, Shelton was second in the high jump at 4-6 and Jeneatha Marshall second in the shot put (33-5¾). Mikell Dolo was third in the hurdles (10.13) with Wilson fourth in 10.39. Gracious Klah was fourth in the shot (33-0¼).

Tomara Carmichael of Palmyra won the Group 1 shot put with a mark of 37-2. Lilly Beck was second in the hurdles (10.05).

S.J. Group 4 boys

Shot putters Tariq Hills and Maurice Johnson accounted for 14 of the 35 points Rancocas Valley tallied for a share of third place with Toms River North. Hills placed second with a throw of 51-2½ and Johnson third (49-8¾).

Ali Haqq was third in 7.96 in the 55 hurdles, and the team of Brandon Boggs, Vincent Brown, Samuel Keleekai and Brian Merriman teamed for third in the 4x400 in 3:30.14.

Merriman was fourth in the 400 (50.38) and Jake Tyndale was fourth in the 1,600 (4:27.35).

Shawnee's Mitchell Casey cleared 13 feet to win the pole vault and teammate Zachary Lill was fourth at 12-0. Mark Miller placed second in the 1,600 in 4:23.88 and fourth in the 800 in 2:00.14.

Nick Falk of Cherokee won the 3,200 in 9:31.84. Lenape's Chase Campbell was fourth in the 55 dash (6.74).

S.J. Group 4 girls

Sydne Nance of Rancocas Valley won the high jump with a 5-2 clearance, leading the Red Devils to 35 points. That was good for a three-way tie with Lenape and Kingsway for second place.

Aliyah Taylor was second for R.V. in the dashes (7.22, 59.55). Danielle Steff was fourth in the shot put (37-4).

Lenape was aided by a second-place finish in the 4x400 with Dana Duffield, Shannon Lambert, Ciaron Williams and Shelby Whetstone finishing in 4:05.9. Rancocas Valley was fourth in 4:08.58 with Brecaïn McClenahan, Darynn Minus-Vincent, Nance and Shauna Nuss.

Cassie Hoxit was second for Lenape in the pole vault (9-6). Megan Quimby was third in the 800 (2:19.29) and fourth in the 1,600 (5:08.76). Duffield was third in the 400 (59.58).

The sectionals for South Jersey Groups 2 and 3 are scheduled for Friday at the Bennett Center, with the Central Jersey Groups 2 and 3 meets slated for next Sunday.
